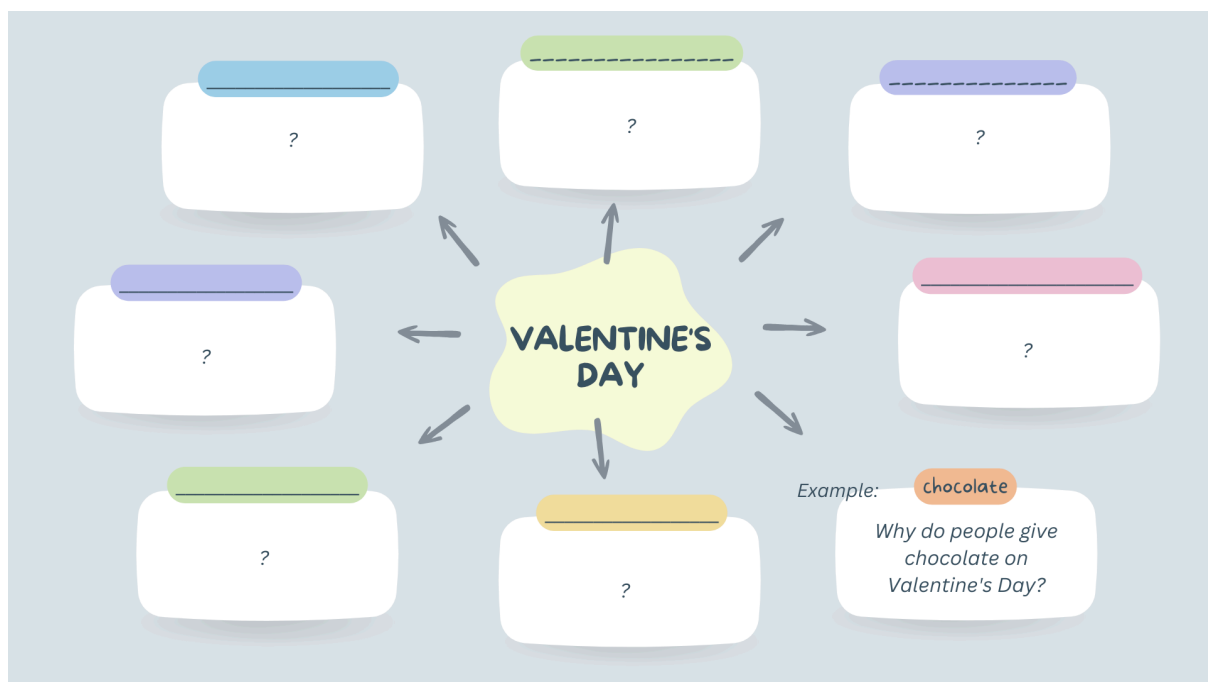

1. The festival of Lupercalia was an ancient Roman festival that took place on February 15th and involved sacrificing animals and touching women with pieces of their skin to increase fertility. It later became associated with Valentine's Day.
2. Pope Gelasius I replaced the festival of Lupercalia with St. Valentine's Day, eliminating the sacrifices and focusing on love.
3. One Valentine was prosecuted for refusing to worship Roman gods and signed a letter "from your Valentine" to a woman he allegedly healed from blindness. Another Valentine, St. Valentine of Terni, secretly married couples against the emperor's orders.
4. February 14th is considered a day of love in remembrance of St. Valentine because he was executed on that day for arranging marriages, which went against Emperor Gothicus' beliefs.
5. The first greeting card for Valentine's Day was made in the 16th century and included the question "Will you be my Valentine?"
6. Esther Howland was one of the first US manufacturers of Valentine's Day cards, while Richard Cardbury created the first chocolate box in 1868.
